From Steve's introduction to the Newsletter, you can tell all 13 of us who journeyed to Japan had a wonderful

time. We began our stay at a hotel in the Ginza (shopping) District of Tokyo. For our first two days we were met at 9 am by members of the FF Tokyo club who shepherded us to different sites in Tokyo on foot and by subway, including a walk through the Ginza, the fish market, Sensoji Temple, the Metropolitan Building and Meiji Shrine.



On the third day we were joined by a professional tour guide and bus for a tour of several sites in Yokohama, before departing the




next day for Fujiyoshida (our Colorado Springs sister city), Mt Fuji and the hot springs near Hakone. After an overnight in Hakone, we went by bullet train to Kyoto, the old capital of Japan. We were able to visit several UNESCO World Heritage Sites and had a side trip to Nara and Osaka. From Kyoto we again boarded the bullet

train for a three-hour ride to Fukuoka, on the southern island of Kyushu, where we met our FF Fukuoka hosts and began our 5-night homestay.

The Fukuoka club had a wonderful program planned for us which included a Japanese culture day (making sushi and yakisoba, a tea ceremony, and calligraphy), a tour of a Japanese garden, meeting Japanese drum players and hearing them play, a garden party with Japanese food and being dressed up in traditional Japanese clothes, and a delightful farewell party with entertainment by both clubs. We sang "Getting to Know You", "America the Beautiful" and with both clubs joining arms we all sang "Let There be Peace on Earth".

A Greek Women's Monastery

In April, I travelled to Thessaloniki, the second largest city in Greece to see my youngest daughter, who is on a semester abroad from Colorado Mesa University. I had one completely free day by myself, the day before travelling back to Colorado, and I made plans to visit a Greek Orthodox women's monastery in Ormylia, a small town in the Halkidiki peninsula. Halkidiki is located in Macedonia, and is a popular destination in Northern Greece, due to its amazing beaches with silky sand and clear turquoise waters.

I took the one-and-a-half hour bus ride from Thessaloniki, through quaint little villages with iconostasis (small churches or wayside shrines) in their front yards until we reached Ormylia. I had been told that I would be able to find taxis to get me from Ormylia to the monastery, but discovered there were none. In addition, it had started raining and getting cold and I had not brought a jacket with me. I walked into *Delicieux* a local bakery, to ask how far away the monastery was. The owner, a pretty lady in her 40's, took one look at me and told me it was too cold outside and that I needed a jacket. After I had purchased a coffee and pastry she went to the back and brought me a warm jacket that she insisted I wear. "How kind of you," I said to her. "This is only human," she replied.

With the bakery owner's cozy jacket and warm coffee in hand I started walking up the hilly road to the monastery, thinking it would take no more than 20 minutes to get there. My GPS was telling me that it would be a much longer walk. The thought of hitch-hiking came to my mind, just as an old truck came to a full stop alongside me. Without my speaking any Greek, and the older man in the truck speaking no English, we agreed that he would give me a ride to Ormylia Monastery. Up the windy roads and olive groves, I peered sideways to see if the craggy weathered face was one that I could trust, and decided that yes, it was.



The visit with the Orthodox Sisters was truly wonderful, and there were visitors from many parts of the world. The sisters served us Turkish delight, Turkish coffee and iced water. We walked around the lovely grounds in the drizzling rain, went into their small church with the many icons and visited the gift shop filled with homemade soaps, tapestries, and honey. At the end of the afternoon visit, I met a young man from Australia who was visiting the monastery who agreed to drive me all the way back to my hotel in Thessaloniki, instead of taking the bus. This topped off my magical and miraculous day in Ormylia!

Friendship Force & Habitat for Humanity Collaborate on a Project in Moinesti, Romania

A construction team of 13 Friendship Force members consisting of 12 women and one man returned on September 7, 2019, from a one-week collaboration volunteer project with Habitat for Humanity building a 4-plex home in Romania. The team, two in their 80s, two in their 60s, and the others in their 70s, were proactively involved in constructing a home in the village of Moinesti (Bacau region), Romania, population 21,787.

The volunteers were not relegated to being sideline cheerleaders, snack makers, nor water servers. Picture Rosie the Riveter! Each member served as a hands-on construction worker: involved in measuring, cutting, sawing, and installing plywood; assembling steel scaffolding; screwing and hammering together 2x4s; as well as drilling holes and then screwing and tightening rebar between the first and second floors of the home.

Friendship Force club members included: FF Florida Suncoast, the convening team, under the leadership of Betty and Chuck Oldanie, with members Geri Espy, Christine Michalek, Judy Ormsby, Karen Sheretts, and Marilyn Whelan. Other FF clubs represented were: FF Dallas – Felicity Sentence; FF Denver – Susan Raymer; FF Minneapolis – Susanne Wolter; FF Southern Oregon – Mavis Marney; FF Southwest Florida – Michelle Kemps; and Kathleen Gallagher of FF Solothurn, Switzerland.

Each worker came with a dedicated commitment to fulfilling both the mission of Friendship Force: "promoting understanding, cultural education and citizen diplomacy through homestay Journeys and personal friendship" and Habitat for Humanity: "seeking to put God's love into action and bringing people together to build homes, communities, and hope."

At a closing reception and ceremony, the volunteers received certificates of appreciation from Moinesti mayor Valentin Vieru and the Moinesti on-site Habitat for Humanity Volunteer Coordinator Victor Teris.

Coordinator Steve Tindell called the meeting to order at 10:06 AM. He welcomed the new council members and asked them what positions they were each interested in holding. Geri moved to approve the positions and members and Dick seconded. The positions and the members holding them for 2023 were approved unanimously. The positions and members holding the positions are stated above. Steve Tindell read the Nov. 8, 2022 minutes. LEOs are usually held during the winter months in place of a general membership meeting the 3rd Tuesday of every other month. Leadership Council meetings are usually held on the 1st Tuesday of the month. The next council meeting will be on March 7. Free and low-cost meeting sites were discussed.

Note: the date of the March meeting has been changed to March 28.

Steve has received a request from the Columbia Cascade FF club in Oregon/Washington to visit us and inviting us to visit there. Dates are unspecified. There is also the possibility of an outbound journey to Detroit in 2024 and one to Cornwall/ Isle of Wight contingent on FFI approval.
