We had a fun, interactive and informative international potluck to celebrate World Friendship Day and the 35th Anniversary of Friendship Force International (FFI). FFNC members provided a variety of appealing ethnic main dishes and side dishes that were enjoyed by seventy-one members and their guests. Each of the nine tables had a host and designated country he or she had visited. Each was tastefully and thoughtfully represented using a variety of techniques including dishware, artifacts, snacks and trivia activities all of which facilitated discussion about and appreciation of the country represented. In addition, each host shared aloud to all in the room information about the country represented at their table so that we all learned about each country. EXCHANGE: MYANMAR

Democracy continues to make inroads in Myanmar (Burma). In February, 2013, FFI is sponsoring a Global Discovery Trip under FFNC's leadership.

Some of you may remember our successful Mission Trip in 2006 when we visited the 7th floor apartment of Tin Aung Moe for an authentic Burmese supper and visit. Moe has been my guide and co-traveler for each of my 5 prior trips to Myanmar. In 2004 he received an invitation and materials to start a FF club there, but the political atmosphere was not yet ready. Now with the political changes of the past year, we are encouraged for a more positive outcome with this humanitarian aid and exploration trip.

We shall again explore the interests of the Myanmar people in forming a club to join us in our global goals. We have been offered some home visits and home meals and the government has authorized overnight stays as an option in an ethnic minority Long House.

In addition to the tourist sites (see above), we shall deliver medicines, health equipment, learning aids, clothes and toys to NGO orphanages, nunneries and monastery schools. We shall view at least 1 of 25 completed water purification systems in orphanages, an ongoing project underwritten by Rotary.

Past trips have included novice parades,

engagement and wedding parties, festivals and puppet shows.
