APRIL 11 MEETING-EGYPT

Join us at our April 11 meeting to hear Wahid Awad speak about his homeland. Wahid is a CSU doctoral student in plant breeding and genetics and is "a political activist with an agenda to end the continuous political turmoil in Egypt. My goal (post CSU) is to run for parliamentary elections...and to guide the nation out of political turmoil and into the light of social justice and human dignity."

Wahid says, "Egypt is a very important country in the Middle East with special interest to the USA. Egypt is a nation of great, mysterious history, a very interesting present, and a hopeful future. First, I will review Egyptian history, culture, politics and other facts about my country. Second, I would like to talk about the Egyptian revolution—exactly what happened in January 2011, and June 2013, and why." Wahid encourages us to ask questions about Egyptian history, culture, reli-

Our 37th celebration of World Friendship began with a Getting to Know You social



Building life-long relationships with hosting...through sharing your home. This Friendship Force activity will enrich your life (Gary Cummins)


Marcia Ross Adding on extension experiences after a home stay; such as cruises, bike tours, bus tours, or ... (Marcia Ross)
