# JOURNEY MEMORIES: BRISTOL & HALLE

Our January program was a trip down Memory Lane for the 12 members who participated in the Bristol-Halle Journey in fall 2018. They shared the Pre -Journey to Stratford Upon Avon and London taken by five of the group. What fun to visit all the places that inspired Shakespeare; Anne Hathawav's cottage (wife). his school, his church and the new, modern theater where his plays are performed.

After several days, it was on to London to see many of the famous sites: **Westminster Abbey, Tower of London, the London Eye, Big Ben, the British Museum & more Shakespeare.** The Bristol group met us in London with a chartered bus for the 3-hour drive to a delightful welcome lunch, then "home" to relax for the evening. The week was filled with appreciation for the gorgeous countryside, age-old buildings, cathedrals, bridges, and a historical rebuilt village at St. Fagan's Castle in Wales. Here are just a few of our adventurous sites:

**Blaise Hamlet,** where estate workers lived in lovely thatched-roof houses **The Clifton Suspension Bridge**, built in 1864

**St. Mary Redcliffe Church** with lunch in the **Arc Café** (Bangers and Mash) Met the **Lord Mayor of Bristol, Cleo Lake**, with tea in her private chambers **Stourhead** was 2,650 acres of pure beauty:

the mansion, artwork, Greek pavilions, gardens, the chapel, and our picnic lunch **Castle Combe**, a picturesque village that hasn't changed in 500 years

Wells, with its phenomenal cathedral, & through the gorge to Cheddar, origin of the cheese

**St. Fagan's Castle**, 40 acres that included homes and businesses moved from all over Wales to show what past living was like from 1200's to post-war 1950's

**City of Bath** - a World Heritage Site, which included the ancient Roman Baths (1<sup>st</sup> Century AD) and another Cathedral with intricate architecture inside and outside...the stained-glass windows were breathtaking

We ended our stay with a fish & chips "Farewell Dinner" & entertainment by the Uke-aholics Band...it was a great sing-along because we knew all the songs they played. A good time was enjoyed by all!

Mid-Journey was a time to recharge and relax in a nice hotel between homestays. However, we were in Berlin and it just happened to be Unity Day (a celebration of the uniting of East/West Germany). Needless to say, there were numerous happenings that we just had to experience:

### The Brandenburg Gate

### Checkpoint Charlie and The Wall Museum

**The Reichstag Building,** seat of the German government; and the Bundestag (parliament) Cruise on the **River Spree** 

An organ concert in a local church

The Berlin Bears, artistically decorated

A big thanks to the 7-8 members of FF Berlin who arranged bus transportation and gave personal tours around Berlin.

Our Halle (Saale) Journey opened many new insights for us as our German hosts shared with us over the week. Our Journey began with:

A walking tour of **Halle**, known for the salt mines and trading; it's known as the town of 5 towers which included: the clock tower, church with 2 Gothic towers and 2 Romanesque towers; **Handel's hometown** 

The 7-mile Winery Walk, tasting along the way (free day)

- **Freyberg** with the Rotkappechen Winery (origin of sparkling wine-Champagne) and the 900+ year old Schloss Neuenburg Castle (free day)
- Tour of **Leipzig**; train station, opera house, Panorama Building, St. Thomas Church where **J.S. Bach** was organist & choir director
- Monument to the Battle of the Nations 4 countries united to fight Napoleon in 1813; 110,000 were killed over 3 days; this is the largest monument in Europe
- Tour of **Dresden** leveled during WWII, rebuilt in original building styles; Royal residences, Zwinger; Semper Opera House; Cathedral of the Holy Trinity; the Procession of Princes (timeline of Witten royal line of Saxony 1127 to 1904, it is 30 ft. tall and 630 ft. long made of 25,00 Meissen porcelain tiles; and the Jousting court behind the royal palace
- Tour of **Wittenberg** home of **Martin Luther**; visited the 360° panorama painting of life in Luther's time, 1517, a must see! Luther Museum; and the Castle Church where 95 theses are posted.

Again, we experienced a delicious "Farewell Dinner" and a singing performance from the FF Halle members, a night to remember.

The <u>Post-Journey</u> is often taken by a few folks after a Journey to countries, cities, or sites on the way back to Colorado. We shared memorable experiences from these brief trips taken by different members of our group to:

### Paris, France - Iceland - Prague, Czech Republic - Switzerland

Our Journey was blessed with safe and joy-filled travel. We became closer friends, made new friends and are all looking forward to the FFI World Conference July 2019 in Boulder; hoping to reunite with those we met.


