Costs: \$3160 includes all flights, FFI & hosting fees, private tours, guides, accommodations, most meals \$160 for required Visa



Our condolences are extended to the families of our friends Al Sheahan and Marian Wemple.

Al Sheahan, long time Friendship Force member, passed away on May 19, 2012 at the Peaks Care Center in Longmont. He was born on May 2, 1930 in Wichita, KS to Leo and Elizabeth Sheahan where he grew up on a farm near Kingman, KS, one of 8 sons and 4 daughters. The family moved near Formoso, KS in February 1946 where Al graduated from high school in May of 1948. Following a long time dream, he moved to CO where he lived at various times in Longmont, Estes Park, Fort Collins and Loveland.

Marian Wemple, FFNC member during the 1990s, passed away on May 3, 2012. Marian and her husband, Ron, were active in Friendship Force as members and leaders: Ron was president in 1994 and secretary in 1995, and they led a humanitarian exchange to St. Petersburg in 1993.

MAY MEETING FEATURED LOADS OF LOVE



Dave & Diane Mills recently shared their humanitarian visit to Mbale, Uganda with an Austin, Texas group that builds and sustains **"Libraries of Love**". This project was initiated eight years ago by Trudy Marshall, a retired Austin librarian. Trudy has inspired these modern-day Missionaries of Reading to create 24 libraries, benefitting 30,000 students. Since English is the language of schools, recycled books that are in good condition have found a new home in this African nation.

Dave shared some interesting facts about Uganda such as:

- GDP in Uganda is \$1,200/yr. compared to \$48,000/yr. USA
- Average family has 7 children (down from 10)
- Life expectancy is 49 yrs. compared to 77 yrs. in USA
- Agriculture primary industry; coffee, tea, fruit, vegetables
- Religion 84% Christian and 12% Muslim
- Literacy rate is 77% for men and 58% for women



The Texas volunteers work for 1 year preparing the gently used books with library pockets and codes on the book spines. Books are sent in a large shipping container to Uganda awaiting the mission team's arrival. The team of 14 remodeled the classroom dedicated for the library with paint and shelving while other team members sorted the 4,000 books for organizing when shelves are completed.

They worked from 9:00 to 3:00 to finish one school library, and during their visit were able to complete three elementary libraries. Celebrations were planned and thanks given for this generous gift that blessed so many children and families.

Through beautiful slides of their visit, the Mills were able to share the culture of this area as we learned about clothing, foods, housing, transportation and "Field Day" at a local school. We saw a classroom with 137 children (70 boys, 67 girls). This elementary school had 3,850 students, however, most schools were smaller with an average of 50 students per class.





The animal photos were a delight as we viewed baboons, old cape buffaloes, hartebeasts, kob, elephants, hippos, crocodiles sleeping with open mouths, and giraffes of all sizes. Thank you Dave and Diane for sharing your African adventure and goodwill journey...we think you'd fit right with the Friendship Force of Northern Colorado!

JEWELS OF CENTRAL EUROPE DISCOVERY EXCHANGE

There is progress on the Jewels of Central Europe exchange. The dates have been tentatively set for **September 23 to October 8, 2013**. We just learned that we will have a 2-night homestay with the FF club in Bratislava. When they learned we were coming on a Discovery Exchange, they very kindly invited us for a short homestay for October 3rd and 4th.

In addition to the four countries already on the schedule, Poland has been added. We will visit Prague first, then travel to Cracow (their spelling), Budapest, Bratislava, and Vienna. We will be two nights in each city, except Budapest, where we will have one extra night.

Definite pricing cannot occur until we are well within a year of the departure date, but the hope is to keep the fee in the vicinity of \$3,600. Travel will be during the fall shoulder season, which will help control the cost. NEWS FROM BETTY JEAN DEMERSSEMAN, MT. STATES FIELD REP

FFI is working on a new Leadership Training Manual. I volunteered two of our own, Cinda Clark and Nancy Brigden, to be consultants for this project.

The **35th FFI World Conference** will be in **Hiroshima Oct.31** - **November 3**. Sign up is going well with about 100 delegates registered so far. There are 15 different clubs in Japan that are preparing for post conference hosting. Attending the World Conference and post-conference exchange is great way to make contacts for future exchanges, especially when the Ambassadors are from all over the globe.

Health and Mobility Issues were addressed at the Regional Conference. Each club has a greater responsibility to utilize the new FFI policy and checklists to communicate the levels of activity and mobility that each exchange will have. Exchange directors are expected to "accept only those ambassadors who are capable of participating fully in the planned activities, and accept hosts who are able to carry out the host-

ing responsibilities. When someone at the conference call asked what was the most compelling discussion, I mentioned two parts of the Health and Mobility Issue. One is if a person is unable to participate in only one day's activity, must that person still decline to go on the exchange? The reps agreed that if there is no alternative activity given, then that person can not participate in the exchange. The second part of the question was "What if I just stay on the bus?" This option is not as simple as it seems. If the bus has to be moved and the tour guide is not there with his umbrella of insurance, then you can't stay on the bus.
