MAY 10 MEETING PROGRAM - MYANMAR

In February, Dot Cada led a Global Discovery Exchange to Myanmar with the goal of establishing contact with people there, as "trusted partners" and introducing the Friendship Force concept. Building on the trusted partner relationships, the hope is to able to begin one or more Friendship Force clubs in Myanmar, with the support of mentoring clubs, including Friendship Force of Northern Colorado.

Dot, exchange director, and ambassadors Harrison Cochran and Don Winters shared photos and information about their experiences in Myanmar. They reported that the people were very welcoming, friendly and eager to learn about Friendship Force.

During their three weeks in Myanmar, Dot and the group of 23 ambassadors traveled throughout Myanmar, and met with people. The meetings were very

encouraging, resulting in having four cities expressing interest in Friendship Force: Yangon, Mandolay, Bagan and Inle Lake.

People were very receptive to establishing the trusted partnerships, with all parties sharing the goal of working together to promote world peace. These four cities are taking the first steps to establish Friendship Force clubs. FFNC will be the mentoring club for Yangon.

While in Myanmar, the Friendship Force group also delivered medical supplies to orphanages, water purification system materials (partnering with Rotary for this project), and took pen-pal letters to children in Bangan from a school in California. All of the humanitarian aide projects, as well as the building of relationships to help establish Friendship Force clubs in Myanmar were very successful. Dot plans to organize another Friendship Force visit to Myanmar, in January or February of 2014.

NEWS FROM FIELD REP, BETTY JEAN DEMERSSEMAN

June 2013

Five new Field Reps are being added to the Conference Call on June 20th. This includes our own new field rep, Barbara Guilford from Friendship Force of Cheyenne. Other new FRs added are Marilyn Peterson, (Pacific Northwest/Northern Rockies), Gordon Carscadden, (West Coast/Hawaii), Sandy Gourdine, (Florida), and Tom Laggay, (Southeast).

The CEO search for Friendship Force International has completed interviews with the candidates and sent videos of the interviews to the members of the committee that were unable to participate in the interviews. This round has been narrowed down to the top two candidates. These two will be interviewed via Skype before narrowing it down to the top candidate to recommend to the Board. It is hoped to have someone in place by July 15. Roger Gatlin suggested having a video of the new CEO for the FFI members to get to know them a bit. This is a suggestion that will be recommended to the Board.

The new fees will be implemented in 2014. FFI exchange fees will be \$165 for US Ambassadors and \$140 for International Ambassadors." In 2015 Club Membership fees will be increased to \$15 for individuals and \$25 for families.
