

Why CU in Boulder? Using an academic backdrop for the venue will communicate our "Mission" and experience a new direction for the 2019 World Conference and future World Conferences. Majority of the CU students will be gone in July; CU administrators and staff will be available. A Campus venue offers meeting rooms and large conference rooms, CU campus housing is affordable for \$36 per night. Dining room offers an array of cuisine for breakfast, lunch and dinner at low prices of \$10. There is a variety of restaurants within walking distance on the "Pearl Street Mall" downtown. There is an expectation of 400-500 people as it will be more affordable for all.




Friendship Force Pledge

As you may know, our Friendship Force of Northern Colorado sponsors one of the gardens at the Loveland Sculpture Park. It is nice publicity for us, as our club is designated with a plaque as caretaker for that area.

Since last year, FFNC has made a change, and we only sponsor the "easy" half of the garden, so our endeavors take much less time. The annual clean-up of the gardens at the sculpture park, will take only an hour or so if we have enough hands to help.

The day the city has chosen is Saturday, June 2nd. The High Plains Arts Council provides refreshments (usually fresh fruit, pastries and various drinks,

including water) for all the gardeners. In addition, those who work with us on the garden are eligible for free tickets for the August Sculpture in the Park show.

Please donate an hour on that day, or let me know another day you can help. It truly is fun, a good way to get to know fellow FF members, and the camaraderie is great.

Time & Place: Saturday, June 2nd. Start at 8 or 9 AM, your choice, but while it is still cool. At Loveland's 31st Street and Beech, beside the sculpture, "They Are Waiting". (We'll be waiting for YOU!)

Equipment: Bring gloves, sunscreen, a hat, and if you have them: a hand spade, a rake, a shovel (for mulch provided by the city), clippers, (small or large). We have not had problems with mosquitoes, but if you are particularly bothered by them, you could bring repellent, just in case.

Things we'll be doing: Cutting Russian sage, a bit of weeding, clearing dried day lily foliage, spreading mulch.

None of it is very hard work, especially with many hands. We hope you will join us for this short-term project!
