

# Information about recently approved terminology changes from Friendship Force International CEO, Jeremi Snook

Turning the page at FFI and opening our mission to a wider demographic means respecting a need for evolution in the words we use to describe FFI. The terms we have been comfortable with for many years - might have to adapt to new norms in order to effectively communicate our mission. Journeys were originally known as "exchanges," which came from our organization's early history when communities would actually exchange large delegations of citizen ambassadors. Recently, we have transitioned to using the more transformational term "journey," since it is better suited to the amazing programs our members plan and experience as they journey to become a temporary citizen for a few days through our home hospitality program. We think this gets you straight to the heart of a country and its people. After much research and discussion, these changes in terminology have been approved by FFI:

Exchanges are now called JOURNEYS

Exchange Directors are now called JOURNEY COORDINATORS (JC)

Leader of an incoming Journey is HOST JOURNEY COORDINATOR (HJC)

Leader of outbound ambassadors is AMBASSADOR JOURNEY COORDINATOR (AJC)

I invite you to continue on this journey with me of opening our mission and organization to the world and do all we can to connect with the thousands of members just waiting to join FFI by incorporating the voice of how future generations talk about the world, leaning on sound research, and extending a little trust and understanding. Together we will make 2017 not only a year of celebration around our 40th anniversary, but also a year of great growth!

# TERRY PODMORE LEADS VOLUNTEERS IN SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE PROJECT IN UGANDA By THELMA SLOCUM, REPORTER


Terry Podmore, a native of England and CSU Professor Emeritus in Civil and Environmental Engineering for 30 years, spoke to us at the February 10th FFNC meeting. He is a staff member of EMI (Engineering Ministries International) and a professional engineer in irrigation of water projects and agricultural projects in **Uganda** and The Dominican Republic. EMI is an association of Christian design professionals volunteering to serve the world's poor with their unique expertise such as architects, engineers, surveyors, construction management, designing hospitals, orphanages, schools, water systems and other life-giving facilities that express the love of God.

A project in **Uganda** has focused on sustainable agriculture at their pastoral and agricultural training center. Terry led a team of 11 (consisting of 4 Ugandans, 6 engineers, architects and Intern volunteers) on an acreage of land in rural Africa for two weeks. The team surveyed the land and gave a site assessment of irrigation needs, plants, fences, soil condition, sandy loam soil and clay loam for cultivation, and top soil and depth in an area called Mary's farm supposedly where Mary, Martha and Lazarus lived. Their job was to design a master plan for 80 acres to be built over 10-20 years to include buildings for research, a church for spiritual teaching, roads, paths, solar and wind needs, deforestation and poverty. They built a center of commerce and built Mary's market. The first year, students plotted 12 acres and later added 300 laying chickens, 200 broiler chickens (for eggs and meat). Added also would be 20 pigs, 10 dairy cows, fish ponds, and 2 systems for waste. They will use animal waste as bio cooking fuel. The crops would be soybeans, maize, elephant grass, rice, plantain, mush, vegetables and fruit. While there they attended a non-denominational church and a Catholic church together.

Leaving Uganda with the master plan, they then moved on to work in the Lake Victory area, and to Zimbabwe, a former British Colony that gained its independence in 1980. Unemployment is 90%, industries are shut down, and there is a decline in social services. They have a law that 51% of business be Zimbabwean ownership.

Terry's most recent volunteer project has been in the Dominican Republic where, with World Vision, his group renewed a derelict irrigation system.
