

Her first set of photos were from her trip to Panama with Cheryl, Nita, Barb T., Kay, T. & Cindy K., from California. They flew into Panama City and took a boat to their hotel. They toured around the Panama City area and visited a village of a native tribe on an island. The men were playing instruments and women wearing colorful native dresses were dancing. Also they saw many monkeys, including one species that looked like half cat, half monkey. Of course seeing the Panama Canal & locks was a highlight.

Rona, being the adventurous person she is, flew into Rome by herself and met up with a FF group from Pennsylvania. She visited the Vatican, the Coliseum, with a removable floor, and showed little cars parked about 6 inches apart. Venice was very impressive.
