#### MYANMAR OPPORTUNITY BY DOT CADA

Have you ever wanted to know how you could help a family to have a better living?



The overwhelming response we had in January 2014 at Aung San Suu Kyi's Education Network, with our "Pilot" of 2 ESL teachers from Japan and 4 of us to teach the "Conversational English", was a truly rewarding lifetime experience. Kevin called the experience in January "life changing".

Our FFNC club is the mentoring club for Myanmar and this first trip under the FFI tagline, "*Explore, Discover and Serve*" will arrive in Yangon on March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015. It is my 9th trip and the third trip for Ms. Danny Cuneo, who as a teacher, will be the



Co-Leader. We hope to locate another teacher to work with Danny on the curriculum development while I work on promoting new Friendship Partners and furthering our contacts with Rotary, Compassionate Hands Myanmar, and Inter-Collegiate Myanmar. English instruction will be 3 hour sessions for 8 days for each educator with the other half of the day for lesson planning, free time and half day tours every other day. The group will then continue on to Bagan to see the ancient ruins with local people still working the land around the pagodas and temples. The group will make a stop at Sister's Baptist Orphanage and then travel on to Inle Lake to see the boat rowers who stand on one leg, with the birds and mountains rising in the background. Due to the 10+ years of trips with our FFI in-country promoter, the group has an invitation to his children's Novice Ceremony. Then we'll travel back to Yangon for the 4th year Celebration on the 4th of April with Certificates of Appreciation being presented. Extension to Mandalay and a hill station is optional.



Cost is expected to be \$2300-\$2500 for land and domestic flights, and the FF package which includes "Day Hosts" in Yangon and meals in Bagan. In Yangon and Mandalay we will be with Friendship Partners. If this combination of "Serving and Sightseeing in Myanmar" is of interest to you, email or call Dot Cada.
